The scheme on the right shows, how you can get involved in the work of Students' Union. One first important step is to join the Students' Council, because there you have the possibility to find solutions for the problems of your study program, thanks to strong ties to professors. STUDENTS' COUNCIL

The Students' Council (in German: 'Fachschaftsrat') is an elected group of twelve students from one faculty, so there are four of those councils at Bauhaus University at all (one for every faculty). The members of the councils are elected by all the students of one faculty and some of them are also delegated to other commissions, which you can see on the right of this scheme.

The Students' Council keeps an eye on your rights as a student and may help you, if there are any problems with your professors, your classes or other issues related to your studies at Weimar. It also supports students in their daily life and organises the welcome week for new students.

STUKO-DEPARTMENTS

The Departments (in German: 'Referate') are responsible for certain tasks of students' administration. There are a handful of departments that support the Students' Union (StuKo), like Treasury, International Department and some more. Usually two students work in one department, and they don't necessarily need to be members of the Students' Union or Councils - every student may do that. STUKO-INITIATIVES

Initiatives are student projects, that exists for a longer time (often many years) and are not related to university courses. They are supported by the Students' Union for example with money or advices. You find many of them in the M18, the students' house at Marienstraße 18, like the café s140, the students' shop Stift/Kontor, the backstage Maschinenraum and many more. STUDENTS' UNION (StuKo)

'StuKo' stands for 'Studierendenkonvent', which is the Students' Union of Bauhaus University. This is the central committee of student administration. Every Students' Council delegates four students to the StuKo, which means that 16 students from all faculties work together in the StuKo. The Students' Union represents all students to the university and the public. Each semester every student pays 8,80€ to the StuKo. This money is used to support the students' interests and initiatives. Every student can ask for the help of the Students' Union to be part of the students' life in Weimar.

FACULTY BOARD

Every faculty has a Faculty Board, that is responsible for the administration of this faculty. Members of every Faculty Board are the dean and his deputies, professors, teachers and three students from the Students' Council.

SENATE

The senate is the main administrative commission of Bauhaus University and consists of professors, teachers and students from all over the university - there is one student from every faculty.

BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The Board Of Trustees is called 'Universitätsrat' at Bauhaus University and is the highest institution of it's administration. One consultant student is part of this committee.
